The maximum length of the abstracts is either 2 or 4 pages for invited talks or 2 pages for contributed papers. The abstract must be prepared in exact conformity with The INSTRUCTIONS FOR PREPARATION OF ABSTRACTS given on the overleaf of the "SAMPLE" sheet attached separately.

All abstracts are strongly recommended to be submitted electronically via the Technical Program link on the BCEIA website at <www.bceia.org>, or by email sent to <conf@bceia.cn> or <conf@bceia.org> with attachment of the text in Microsoft WORD format. The abstract submission deadline is 8-31-2013. All authors should state the FIELD CLASSIFICATION, your preference for oral or poster presentation and address for further correspondence. No changes are feasible once the paper has been submitted.

If you experience any difficulty with the electronic abstract submission process, please contact the BCEIA office.

Please note that only computer data projectors will be available for oral presentations. Poster boards, 90 cm in width and 120 cm in height, will be provided; details for preparation of the poster form will be sent to the authors concerned in due course.

The average temperature in late October in Beijing is about 18°C.

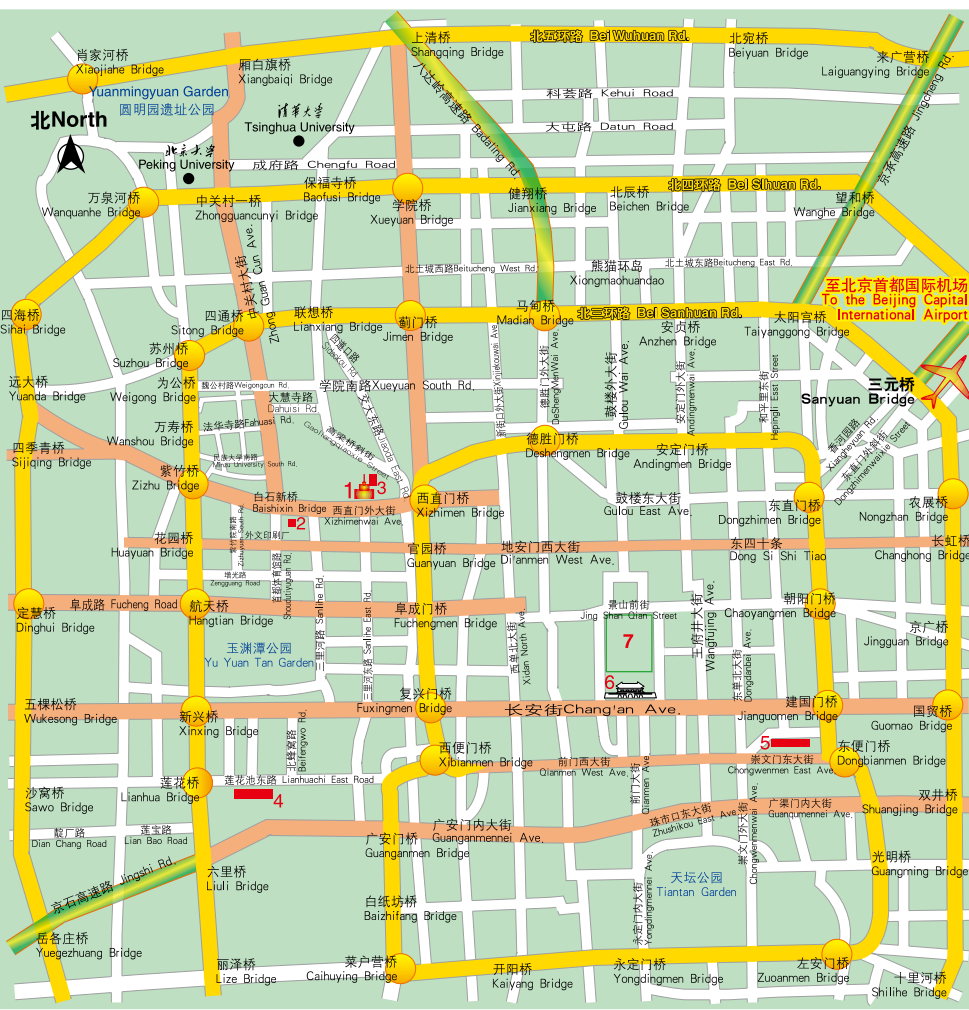
FLIGHT TICKETS

TRANSPORTATION

TOURISM IN BEIJING

With its history of civilization as long as over five thousand years and its very diverse topography and geology, China has not only many ancient wonders but also numerous colorful natural scenic sites. In particular, Beijing, the capital, the politics, culture and science center of China, is a city of long history and one of the focal areas of most fascinating tourist attractions in China, to name a few representatives of them:

The Great Wall, one of the world wonders, built in about 220 B.C., with a total length of 5000 km, remains one of the greatest miracles in the world's history of architecture.

Tian An Men Square, the largest city square in the world. You can find several impressive monuments outlining the Square's perimeter, including the Great Hall of the People, the Mausoleum of Mao Zedong and the Square's famous ceremonial gateway.

The Imperial Palace (formerly known as the Forbidden City) has a history of over 550 years and an area of more than 178 acres. It was used to be the home to 24 emperors of the Ming and Qing Dynasties, and is nowadays open to the public as a museum.

The Summer Palace is the biggest and best preserved one of China's existing royal parks. With the magnificent Lake Kunmin and Hill of Longevity dotted with numerous attractions.

Hutong. In Old China, Hutongs (lanes no wider than 9 meters) are formed by lines of siheyuan (compounds comprising rooms around a courtyard) to connect the ancient city surrounding the Forbidden City. On this tour, travel by rickshaw through Beijing's unique Hutong area to absorb the culture and traditions of old China, including a visit with a local family and kindergarten class and visit the garden of Prince Gong's mansion and experience the lifestyle of Imperial China's elite.

The Ming Tombs, consisting of 13 sites distributed over the foot area of mountains in the northwest suburb of Beijing, are the places where 13 emperors of Ming Dynasty were buried. Among them the Chang tomb is the most magnificent and the Ding Tomb was excavated in 1956 uncovering a wonderful underground palace.

Beijing has experienced great changes over the past 20 years. Modernization construction and development in large scale and high speed have decorated Beijing with numerous skyscrapers, sheltering woods, green grass with colorful flowers as well as web-like high-speed transportation system and made it beyond people's recognition. With the success of 2008 Olympics, Beijing has gained even greater momentum in its march to a fully modernized international metropolis with both Chinese historical and modern cultural attraction.
